



While we haven't had as much work this summer as we would all like, the work we have had was executed well resulting in our success. We are more successful this year than this time last year thanks to the performance of the Bonland team and I expect this success to continue. Furthermore, I expect us to be busy the end of this year going into next year with the work we have on the books. I'm happy that there is plenty of good work available for us to bid and we see opportunities for all three branches with the work that will be awarded in the coming months.

Our incident rate as a company, which is accidents per 100 employees per year has gone from 7.42 in September of 2016 to 8.71 currently which is up from the 5.20 we recorded in spring of this year. South Jersey has gone from 8.23 in September of 2016 to 11.09 currently. North Jersey has gone from 4.56 in September of 2016 to 10.02 currently. We're moving in the wrong direction in New Jersey, however, Pennsylvania has gone from 12.67 in September of 2016 to 5.42 currently, an excellent improvement. In the coming months, we will be hiring new team members. History has shown us that they will get injured at a far higher rate than our current team. Everyone must come up with solutions to keep our new team members from being injured or our incident rate, and possibly our ability to get work, will be negatively affected. Not to mention that no one wants to see a member of our team suffer.

It's a credit to Dan Parent, who retired on May 31, 2017, and John Bansley, SJ Branch Manager that the South Jersey branch management transition has gone smoothly. I was very impressed that Dan worked up to the last hour of his last day and set John up for success and I appreciate Dan's effective ongoing counsel. John is doing an excellent job running the South Jersey branch. I'm confident that we will have many years of success in South Jersey under John's leadership.

In order for us to be successful long-term, we need to offer our customers a unique reason to hire us. It can't be just that we have a competitive price, since it's very easy for any of our competitors to simply lower their price. We offer our customers the shortest time to convert from a bid to a completed space. This is something that requires us to be efficient, organized and flexible. Time and efficiency go hand in hand. If time is spent on rework or fixing problems both efficiency and ability to get the job done are quickly negatively impacted. We must be organized to timely bring our forces to bear on a project. Flexibility is important, since we need to shift our focus rapidly from one task to another.

All of our customers want to get their projects done faster than they are currently being completed. Think about it, aren't you delighted when something you order comes sooner than promised? Our mission going forward is to give our customers that same feeling and if we do, we will have very satisfied customers that recognize us as the leader in the industry. If we have high customer satisfaction, we will enjoy success no matter what the economy. In order to accomplish this, we must continue to improve our efficiency, organization and flexibility.

The safety committee has been busy this year with several tasks aimed at updating the practices and procedures used to keep everyone working in

the shop, and on job sites, safely. This includes developing and maintaining a consistent production equipment training program, ensuring that all employees are properly trained on the safe use and operation of all production equipment they will be using. We are also adding eye wash stations and updating the Lock out/Tag out procedure to match OSHA's.

We have also fitted all 083 Roto-hammers with dust collectors to meet the OSHA Silica dust standard.

Through October 16, 2017 there have been: 15 total injuries with a total of 8 for all of 2016.

10 OSHA Recordable with 6 for all of 2016.

6 Lost work day injuries compared to 3 in 2016.

This is not the direction in which we want to move but we can also use these incidents as a learning experience to help get us to an accident free environment in all areas of the company.

Safe working conditions and practices need to become habits that are done automatically when starting a new day, a new task or walking onto a new work site. Safety is not an accident. Safety is a state of mind that needs to be practiced and refined at all times so we can go home healthy at the end of every day.

Your input would be appreciated as establishing and maintaining a strong Safety Culture requires a team effort!

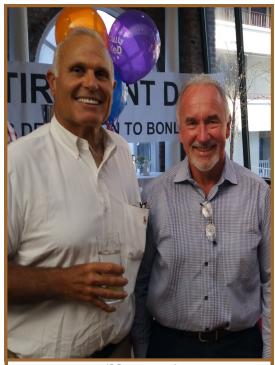
PROMOTION

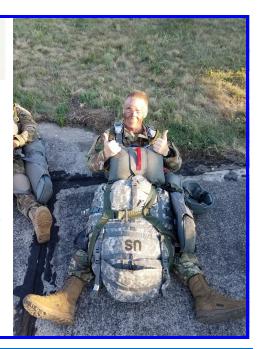

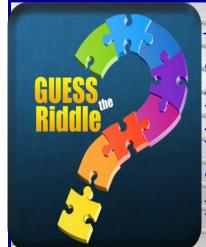
